IMMEDIATE CARE

If you need to be seen today for a non-life threatening condition, choose DCMH's Immediate Care Clinic. While the Immediate Care Clinic can quickly care for you, it should not replace your primary care provider or hospital emergency room.

The Immediate Care Clinic offers walk-in appointments and the ability to self-schedule ahead of time via the "MyHealth" Patient Portal.



Injuries and illnesses happen. When you need to be seen today, visit Immediate Care for:

- Common illnesses such as colds, flu-like symptoms, ear aches, sore throats, fever, or rashes
- Minor injuries such as sprains, back pain, minor cuts and burns, minor broken bones, or minor eye injuries

EMERGENCY ROOM

The hospital emergency room is for very serious or life threatening injuries and health issues. Hospital emergency rooms should not be utilized for common illnesses or minor injuries.

If you are experiencing any of the following symptoms, do not wait! Call 911 or get to the nearest hospital emergency room as quickly as possible.

- Chest pain
- Coughing or vomiting blood
- Deep cuts or bleeding that will not stop
- Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath
- High fevers
- Numbness in the face, arm, or leg
- Seizures
- Severe abdominal pain
- Severe burns
- Sudden blurred vision
- Sudden dizziness, weakness, or loss of coordination or balance
- Sudden, severe headache
- Any other condition you believe is life threatening
